Dreams and Goals of Moving On Ministry (M.O.M.)

Since the start of involvement with jail and prison ministry, Bob has had his heart set (set by God because it was on the list of things Bob said he would not do) to find solutions and answers to the facts of prisons.

For the most part, the term "Correctional Institution" does not fit, the correction seems to be lacking. We realize that something cannot be changed unless it wants to be changed. That lack of wanting change is mostly because of how the "change" is presented.

There is 88% recidivism for inmates in California Prisons, with the rest of the nation approximately the same values. That means that 88% of those seen in prison right now will return when released. Only 11% of the inmates will ever get off of parole.

For 2008, Bob is doing Bible study at BWDF on Mondays and Thursdays.

The Sunday after the 2nd Saturday of each month is Bob and Linda's assigned day for 3 to 4 chapel Services at Corcoran State Prison ("Old" Corcoran). 07/13/08, 08/10/08, 09/14/08, 10/12/08, 11/09/08, & 12/14/08.

Letters that Express it All

We like to post <u>real life</u> situations, because God works in real lives and He is the one that gives "<u>Eternal Life</u>." Every week we get many letters that state "I love hearing the testimonies." There are so many, we cannot publish them all, and the sad part is – people not involved in jail/prison ministry do not get to read the many letters we receive daily (average 2 to 11 each day) and try to keep up with and answer.

Calling of a Soldier

Position ally every believer in Jesus Christ is entrusted with six offices spiritually. These six offices are excluded from any spiritual gift(s) imparted to the believer by the Holy Spirit at the moment of salvation. But basic knowledge and utilization of these spiritual offices is absolutely essential to potentially glorify God within His calling designed for you before the foundation of the world to walk in. The Saint positionally is: Priest, Disciple, Witness, Servant, Ambassador, and Soldier. These six offices belong to every believer and are divided into two categories;

Spiritual Life Christian Service

Priest Servant
Disciple Ambassador
Witness Soldier

The concept is for the believer to better discern between spiritual life and Christian service or duty.

For a believer to desire the noble task of serving the Lord from a heart filled with love in Christian service, is a

commendable thing. Sadly, often times the tragedy we ignorantly might sow, is instead of gathering for the Kingdom of God, we scatter. The Lord has taught me an important principle about the Heavenly calling (Heb. 3:1) provided for every human being, especially them which expressed positive volition in Jesus Christ for salvation.

His desire for us is to first sow to our spiritual life, grow in Bible doctrine. Then we will effectively in grace, reap a fruitful harvest in Christian service. Instead of us saints working on what we could do for God's Son Jesus, our Lord, He desires for us to utilize our Holy calling / spiritual life, and learn of the work His Son Jesus Christ our Savior had done for us at the cross. As Christ's ambassadors, then we will glorify God and mighty exploits through His Church will further make fruitful His body and His kingdom. We shall go forth as soldiers fighting the good fight. Who knows? You could be an Evangelist, or pastor, or a teacher. Only God knows. Who hath saved us, and called us with a "Holy-calling," not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began (2 Tim. 1:9); There is one body, and one spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all (Eph. 4:4-6).

Why are there so many denominations out there in the body and so much division in here? Baptist, Protestant, Apostolic, Catholic, etc. Why? We claim to be rightly dividing the word of God, yet we aren't endeavoring to keep the unity as His church. We say we aren't ignorant of the devil's devices, that we are mature

Christian. I really challenge us to question what we truly understand about Satan and his part as the god of this age, as an angel of light.

We believers in Christ have taken the law of liberty for granted. All things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient; all things are lawful for me, but all things edify not (1 Cor. 6:12; 10:23)

The eyes of your understanding being enlightened, that ye may know what is the hope of His calling; and what the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints (Eph. 1:18).

Believers in Christ have chosen to determine their own calling for their own lives. As "religious legalism" becomes the back-bone for spiritual Christianity. This is a common problem for the members of His Body in the Church. Yet God loves you and me so much and respects our volition (freedom of will), that He allows us Christians to choose our own path in Him. But He hopes we find our true destiny in grace, according to the purpose of the holy calling. Imagine God having a hope that you, me, and every other human being to ever exist, to experience a special and specific calling for our very own spiritual life, including every provision needed to fulfill it.

Sometimes a soldier can forget how important everything really is in my life. To remember every single thing that happens, is for a reason. To lay hold of this high calling. There is a necessity of a strict discipline, hardship, suffering, allowed by the Lord, in order for me not to forget my Citizenship.

For the gifts and calling of God are without repentance – irrevocable (Rom. 11:29)

You don't know me but I have heard of you through many of my friends, and my former cellie, LC. You have been spoken highly of by my cellie JC. My name is DQ and I've been incarcerated here in Corcoran State Prison since 2005. Well, since I've been studying the Bible and doing Bible courses. I'm about to parole in 5 more months and I'm kind of scared what I might do when I get out of here.

I've lost my mother and wife since I've been incarcerated. So I don't have any family out there. I have 3 sisters, but I don't know their addresses. All I know is which city they live in. So, I'm walking out there alone, but I'm afraid I might backslide and loose my faith. So, would you have any advice

you could give me? I don't want to end up doing what I used to do, which ended me up here (Corcoran State Prison). I don't want to come back. I already have 2 strikes and walking on egg shells with the courts. So, I'm not getting any more chances and I don't want to end up doing life. Is there any literature you can send me that I can learn from, or suggestion. I'm open minded to anything which is Christianity, and I always want to learn anything about it. I don't mean to bore you, but you're the only one that might guide me on the right path, as you have others. Also I would like to ask you how is Leo doing and if he is doing well health wise. Me and him have been good friends for many years and also been cellies twice. If you see him, tell him he is always in my prayers. Well Chaplain Bob, thank you for your time and may God bless.

It saddens us when we receive letters like the previous. Where are those "professing Christians" that say they are dedicated to God's children? The scripture says the spirit is willing but the flesh is weak. It also says that when we are on our knees and they are weak from prayer, we will see strength in the spirit.

I stole and prostituted to get drugs and alcohol, but did use protection. So many times I attempted to quit completely. All my relationships were short term and almost always emotionally and physically abusive, only while under the influence. It was hard for me, I couldn't keep a job, get a drivers license or vehicle, and lost a wonderful girlfriend. I lost my families trust, I lost my self respect. Drunk again, high again, frightened again, a failure again. Now I've given my life to the Lord and straight and sober!

Recommended Reading

For the new Christian, or the individual desiring to know God, we would like to recommend the following reading:

The Gospel of John – This is a great introduction of Christ's walk on Farth.

The Book of Romans – This gives an introduction of many of the Bible stories shared and helps build familiarity of Christ's plan for our lives.

The Purpose Driven Life by Rick Warren – 40 chapters will change your life in 40 days

Book of Proverbs – Read one chapter a day with the chapter read being the day of the month. This will allow the book to be read almost 12 times thru the year.

Sharing Your Testimony

- 1. What my life was like before I met Jesus
- 2. How I realized I needed Jesus
- 3. How I committed my life to Jesus
- 4. The difference Jesus has made in my life.

But in reality, those who believe in Jesus have the testimony of God in them; each of us needs to periodically share our testimony with others. The importance is not what you have done, but what God is doing.

- 1. Your testimony;
- 2. Your life lessons
- 3. Your godly passions
- 4. The Good News

I think all will agree, that the testimonies that move people are not the ones written from great minds, but are actually the ones written from a great heart.

In Luke 5 we read the story of the disciples that fished and caught nothing, and then had a carpenter try to teach these professional fishermen how to catch fish.

Luke 5 (King James Version) Cast Your Nets on the Other Side

- 1 And it came to pass, that, as the people pressed upon him to hear the word of God, he stood by the lake of Gennesaret.
- 2 And saw two ships standing by the lake: but the fishermen were gone out of them, and were washing their nets.
- 3 And he entered into one of the ships, which was Simon's, and prayed him that he would thrust out a little from the land. And he sat down, and taught the people out of the ship.
- 4 Now when he had left speaking, he said unto Simon, Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught.

- 5 And Simon answering said unto him, Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net.
- 6 And when they had this done, they inclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake.
- 7 And they beckoned unto their partners, which were in the other ship, that they should come and help them. And they came, and filled both the ships, so that they began to sink.

Luke 5 (New International Version)

The Calling of the First Disciples

- 1 One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the people crowding around him and listening to the word of God.
- 2 he saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets.
- 3 He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat.
- 4 When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch."
- 5 Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, <u>I will let down the nets</u>."

6 When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break.

- 7 So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink.
- 8 When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!"
- 9 For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken,

10 and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will catch men."

11 So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him.

Why did Peter tell Christ he would throw out the net(s)?

What did Peter expect when he cast the net?

Why did Peter say, "Depart from me; for I am a sinful man"?

Doubt? Is Doubt a sin? God says we must come with the faith of a child. Example of David as a young man, then as a King. David went from "faith" to "Foolish".

How often do we exclude God from our working environment?

We hear constantly about the separation of church and state; that prayer should not be in schools; diversity in the workplace. Society is trying to keep God in the church building, and too many times we buy in to it.

How many find Christ while in prison, only to leave Him there when they leave?

What did these professional fishermen think when a carpenter was telling them how to do their business? Do we accept Christ as "The Authority?"

They were tired from failing at what they knew best, yet they obeyed Jesus. He made these fishermen successful at their jobs, but he had a new job in mind for them.

How often do we fail at our jobs?

How often do we fail in life?

Do the failures come when we try to do it in some way other than what God has planned?

What about conflicts we may encounter with others?

How often do we feel like we are just spinning our wheels?

Maybe we haven't looked to the Master/Coach for help. Jesus is asking us to trust Him. He can make us

successful at our job. Remember, success can come in different forms. Even if we are successful in our career, He may have something else in mind for us, just as He did His disciples.

Listen to Jesus

Read the "Owners Manual"

Becoming our Surroundings

Putting our body in a tub of cold water, we become cold. Putting our body in a tub of hot water, we become hot. What we are surrounded by, we become.

How do we avoid sliding back into the previous problems – just as what determines value in real estate, it is "Location, Location, Location. – Location determines the value of our lives as well.

We should also radiate our contents (Christ's filling with the Spirit) so much, that we surround whatever is near us. Our lives should be so overflowing that they splash God on those near us.

We have those that are being released and say "I'm not going to be involved with my old ways. I am just going to hang around with my friends." Remember the analogy of the "Participator" vs. the "Spectator?" The participator is activated and encouraged by the spectator.

So the question comes as to how do we know what book of instructions we are following and what is the order of importance of "things" to us.

Checkbook and bank account...

Christ commands that we be good stewards of the things He has entrusted us with. Look at the spending habits of many individuals. They express more faith in spending (spending

what they do not have) than they express in God.

Importance of where our time and travels are to.

I get amused when someone tells me that they do not have time to do ministry or read the Bible, and then see them spend 4 hours watching a ball game for just enjoyment. Often the individuals will drive for 4 hours to get to a game, then watch for 4 hours, spend large amounts of money for over priced hotdogs and beverages, and then drive back home for 4 hours. Then you will hear from them that they do not have time, money or gas to help with ministry.

Simple as our computer Wallpaper

You can tell what is important to an individual by such items as what they have displayed as their screen saver or wallpaper on their computer. I used to like to display family members, secluded paradise locations, or some of the different cars I liked, on my computer wallpaper and screen saver. Then I realized that those items were displayed before me (and everyone else that came to my office) much of the day. I realized that I needed wallpaper according to "significance" (summary of the 7 S's that we base M.O.M. ministry on) in my life, Now on my wallpaper, you will see Linda holding her "Jail bar Cross" that she received from Bill Glass Ministry. You see, right below God, is the spouse, and a picture of a spouse holding something that represents ministry, just catches it all !!

The Matching Gift

We have many individuals that express their concern for "brothers," "affiliates," "family," and "friends." They see the activities going on in the world and streets. They see the senseless shedding of blood and loss of lives. We see the stand for those who are like thinking or affiliation. The Bible states we are to reach out to the lost, not just the "like." Christ reached out to "all."

Matthew 5:44 But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;

Luke 6:27 But I say unto you which hear, Love your enemies, do good to them which hate you,

Luke 6:35 But love ye your enemies, and do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the Highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and [to] the evil.

Many people are searching for the answer to solve the violence we see all around. I think of a situation that developed with an individual I have done jail ministry with, Mike G.

While Mike was locked up in prison (actually a 4 striker that was sentenced to 42 years), he feared never making it out of prison and dying in a prison facility. He came to a point in his life that he leaned against one of the concrete walls in the prison and started to pray the following; "God, I don't know who you are, where you are, or if you even exist. Reveal yourself to me and do not let me die in this prison. I

promise that I will serve you the rest of my life if you will make sure I don't die in this prison. I am even willing to spend the 42 years in prison serving you, as long as I know I will get out of prison some day."

Mike had served a total of 7 of those 42 prison years, when his case worker called him in to look at her computer screen. He asked, "What do you want me to look at?" She answered, "Look at your name." Mike answered, I don't see it." She said, "Look again." Mike said, I still don't see it." She replied, "Exactly, for some unknown reason, your name was removed from the system 3 months ago, and we need to release you."

During Mike's time in prison, he had kept his Northern affiliation. One day Mike was on the yard and was approached by an individual named Oscar. Oscar was Southern high structure. Oscar looked at Mike and said, "Do you want to play some basketball?" Mike replied, "You know what will happen if we do this?" Oscar replied, "Yes, I know. So, do you want to play?" Mike looked around and said "Let's do it." Almost immediately as they started, about 20-30 individuals of each affiliation gathered around and asked what they were doing? God has moved in my life and I'm only 26 years old. My testimony is this;

After so much death, I found it hard to "Keep the Faith." Wit the faith faltering in my life, I cursed God and hated Him for taking my family away. My life support is what you can call it. I continued my drugs and alcohol intake, consuming an 8 ball of speed in 45 minutes, wishing to die to be with them.

I met my daughter's father at my uncle's house and almost 2 years later, I was granted with my daughter, Kaylynn, now age 6. I quit my drugs 6 months before I found out I was pregnant with her (about 4 months pregnant).

I moved to Bismarck, AR. and got married to a very dear friend of mine. Even though my marriage only lasted 2 ½ years, we gave birth to my second daughter Alizabeth, now 4 years old. After a very depressing, violent, painful, agonizing, and unjust divorce in 2006, I lost my daughters to my ex-husband's mother. For a year under close watchful eyes, I was only able to see my daughters 3 times and never able to bring them home. I finally got justice and was allowed to bring the oldest of the two home.

After that, I moved out of my house and ended up in motel after motel and finally landed in the Dallas Life Foundation (2006) for almost

a year while struggling to keep my head afloat above the turbulent waters of life. I found out I was pregnant with my 3rd child, a beautiful bouncy baby boy, now a year old. My boyfriend, who stuck it out through my stupidity, and I are still together and now have all 3 children in my 4 bedroom, 2 bath house. February of this year, I got my 2nd girl back.

God has the power to give you what you want/need when He believes you are ready. After all my trials of pain, heartache, error in judgment, and me being me (hard headed), I have learned to have some patience and now know that when I pray to Him, He WILL ANSWER my prayers in HIS TIME, not mine. It just takes patience.

p.s. May God please those who read this and know that they ARE NOT ALONE if they have God in their corner.
