JAILHOUSE RELIGION

Text: Matthew 25: 31-46

Most of us have heard the statement, "he has jailhouse religion." By that they are saying that he got religion while he was in jail. They are saying, "just you wait, when he gets out, he will go back to his life of crime." When the prisoner is paroled out he is looked at with suspicious eyes, shunned and in many cases and cast out by his community from which he once lived. He seeks employment, but nobody wants to hire him because he is an ex-con. The employer will either make excuses or will outright say, "we don't want to take any chance on you and so you turn and walk away. He goes to church with hopes that the people there will accept him, for he was told while he was in prison to go to church when you get out. Again, he is given the cold shoulder and shunned by the people.

With all of this rejection, he comes to the place where he says, "what's the use? At least in prison I had a place to live, I had 3 meals a day and I had my friends." Then he goes out and commits a crime so he can go back to prison where he feels wanted. The world would say that they knew it wouldn't last. Then they use this as their statistic to prove that prisoners shouldn't be paroled.

This may not be true in all cases, but it is in many cases. How do I know? Because when I was on the outside for sixty five years, I saw the attitude and I am sorry to say that in most cases that was my attitude also. I see through different eyes now after being in prison for over five years. You will never know what it is like unless you walk in these shoes for a while. Then maybe your eyes too will be opened.

Here are some thoughts I want us to consider when we talk about jailhouse religion.

THE TRUTH NEEDS TO BE GIVEN: John 8:32 says: "And ye shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free." The truth is about the Son of God and His Word. Jesus said in verse 36, "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." How many are shacked by sin and shame and cannot find a way out? Why? It's because they have not heard the truth that can break the shackles. There are so many false religions that want the ears and minds of these precious souls. If you just saw all the books and pamphlets that circulate through these prison walls.

Not only is a man shackled by the sins in his life, but now he is shackled by a false religion. Jesus said in John 5:39 "Search the scriptures, for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are which testify of me." How important it is to get the truth of God's Word into the hands and hearts of these dear men. Just remember what Jesus said in John 14:6, "Jesus said unto him, I am the Way, the truth and the life and no man cometh unto the Father but by me." This is the only hope for men and women who make up the prison system. They need to hear that God loves them so much that He sent His only begotten Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to die on Calvary's Cross for their sins. If they accept the Lord Jesus into their hearts as the repentant thief on the cross did, Christ will wash away all of their sins by His blood that was shed for them. Let's read Romans 3:24 and 25, "Being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus: Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in His blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God;

to declare, I say, at this time His righteousness: that he might be just and the justifier of Him which believe in Jesus."

Christ is the hope for all prisoners. They must know the truth, they must believe the truth and they must accept the truth into their hearts. If they will repent of their sins and accept Jesus Christ as their Savior, then and only then will their lives be transformed. ACCEPTANCE: I thank God for the words that Jesus said to the repentant thief when he trusted Christ, "Verily I say unto thee, today shalt thou be with me in paradise." This was acceptance of the Lord Jesus Christ himself to a transformed thief. If the Lord will accept a prisoner, why can't God's people do the same? Someone once said, "The ground is level at the foot of the cross." It does not matter to God who you are or what background you come from, all men are sinners in need of a Savior. When they come to Christ for salvation and get saved, not only does the Lord accept them, but every born again believer should accept the repentant sinner into their fold. Paul said in Galatians 6:1, "Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted." I am so thankful today, through some turned their backs on me when I was arrested, there are those who stood by me over these nearly 5 ½ years that I have been in. They have accepted me for who I am, forgiven me and pray for me. Praise God for such dear people.

FELLOWSHIP: I can't emphasize enough how important it is for those on the outside to pray for and to encourage the saved prisoners. Jesus said in Matthew 25:35 and 36, "For I was hungry and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger and ye took me in: naked and ye clothed me: I was sick and ye visited me: I was in prison and ye came unto me." When questioned when they did these things unto the Lord, He said in verse 40, "And the King shall answer and say unto them, verify I say unto you, in as much as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me." It is Christ like to do these acts of kindness.

These twelve by six walls begin to close up on us prisoners. What a tremendous blessing it is to get a letter from the outside with words of encouragement, to get a visit from someone from the outside who has been approved to visit a prisoner or to receive a book or a Bible for some prisoner in need. What am I saying? Adopt a prisoner, show your Christian love and be a friend to some prisoner in need. Paul said in Colossians 4:18, "Remember my bonds (chains)." Then the writer of Hebrews says in 10:25, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; exhorting one another and so much more, as ye see the day approaching." Fellowship is so needed.

In conclusion, we talked about jailhouse religion. Yes, there are those who get religion in prison that is not genuine. But then again, there are those who are truly born again believers. How important it is for you folks on the outside to give the truth to these prisoners, accept them when they get saved and be a friend who will keep up with them and fellowship with them. Many of these people will get out someday. What you do with them now can determine the kind of Christian they will be when they get out. Once again, in Colossians 4:18, Paul says, "Remember my bonds (chains)."

God Will Provide

My story starts 10/29/1980, the day I was born. I came into this world struggling. I was not breathing and had to be helped. During my childhood I received a lot of abuse; physical, mental and sexual, which made me bitter and angry. I also had a hard time making friends or talking to people. My confidence and esteem were gone. I didn't know who I was.

I tried first with the wrong type of people. I would be the "thug". I thought I needed to be like this to be liked. Drugs and alcohol helped to numb the pain and to come out of my shell. At the age of 18, I got my first strike. After my release I got my girlfriend pregnant and 2 years later she delivered my second child. Having kids did not slow down my drug use or my crimes. She eventually left me, which sent me off the edge. Then I used a lot more. I was in and out of jail. I continued to do crimes and used meth.

The drugs no longer worked to numb my feelings, which made me even more angry. I burnt a lot of bridges with real friends I had. I didn't trust anyone and hated myself. On January 2, 2009 I was arrested for burglary and two months later was given my second strike and sent to prison for four years.

The first two years I did the normal convict things, but October 7, 2010 I accepted Christ and since then, my outlook has changed. I now love myself as well as others. I have self-confidence and esteem. God is using "my past" to His glory. I share my story with other inmates and I can reach them. I have found myself and I know who I am and that's a child of God.

I will be paroling in 8 months and I am going to continue to serve the Lord. I want to be able to help others like me, if God is willing. When I parole I will be homeless with no one in my life but God and is okay because the Lord will provide. Thank you for reaching out to us, inmates. It really brings a light into this dark world.

California Three Strikes Reform Act for 2012

A Three Strikes Reform Act for 2012, written and prepared by a coalition based at Stanford University, has been submitted to the Attorney General and is awaiting title and summary for inclusion on the November, 2012, ballot.

The re-sentencing provisions of this Act are:


- Prisoners currently serving life sentences for non-serious, non-violent crimes that would not result in a life sentence under the new law can apply for a sentence reduction. A judge must reduce the prisoner's life sentence to a term of years no less than double an ordinary sentence unless the sentence reduction would cause "an unreasonable risk to public safety."
- The burden is on the prosecution to prove by a preponderance of evidence that the prisoner is an unreasonable risk to public safety. The prisoner must be resentenced to the shorter sentence if the prosecution cannot meet this burden.\

Families to Amend California's Three Strikes - FACTS | 3982 So Figueroa St #210 | Los Angeles | CA | 90037

- A prisoner will have a right to a court-appointed attorney at any re-sentencing hearing.
- All relevant evidence can be considered at the sentencing hearing, including but not limited to: prison disciplinary records (both positive and negative reports), health records, family support, sobriety, and employment prospects.
- An estimated 3,000 inmates will be eligible for a new sentence under this initiative. For the complete proposed text of the Act as submitted, contact FACTS.

Although many would like a more encompassing Initiative we at FACTS are prepared to support the passage of this step forward in the 2012 election.
