'Not Knowing' to 'Knowing God.'

Hello – My name is Carmine Aleprete. I would like to share my testimony on 'Not Knowing' to 'Knowing God.'

I was very young when I was put in a Catechisms school. Being young and going to school to learn about God. Remembering the ladies dressed in black and white called 'Nuns.' They seemed very mean and I had absolutely no intension on learning about God.

So I rebelled in school and started out to be the black sheep of the family. My parents were divorced when I was three and my mom worked 2 to 3 jobs all the time.

As growing up, I learned all the excuses in the book why my dad couldn't pick me up to visit. So, I had a lot of resentment towards him.

16 years old was my first experience of being sent away for burglary. Scared and feeling alone, I was sent away for 18 months. Got out and moved in with my dad. New area and that meant new people. Dad let me do whatever I wanted and I took it for granted. Went to school and got a job at Marriott Hotel. Did great for a while until I was going out after work and staying out all night. Coming and if I was drunk, skip school, but go back to work.

I started to sell cocaine everywhere and was making money. I started to come to California, by me driving all the northern states and just cruise the PCH (Pacific Coast Highway), stay a week, then drive all the southern states home. As soon as I graduated, I loaded up my car and didn't say anything to anyone until I got here to California. I was here for about a month and was living it up in Orange County. At least I thought. I met some people at the motel, woke up and me car was gone. I really didn't know anyone and everything I owned was in my car. I ended up getting caught for drugs on me and I went to jail.

This cycle went on and off for years. I decided I had to get to the desert. Went there and got hooked up with people who cooked methamphetamine. Showed me how. I thought this would be cool. I watched how they made it and transported it. Got paid! That easy. Got a 4-bedroom home and told myself, this is mine. Yea, okay!

Well I had a friend come to me and said "Are you going away this weekend?" Which I always did. Yes, I'm leaving Friday and be back Sunday night. He asked if this couple could stay there while I was gone? I thought about it, it was hard, but I said 'yes'.

On my way home Sunday night my phone was vibrating in my vest. I pulled over on my bike and it was my friend letting me know not to go to my house, the chem lab truck is backed up to my garage. There is 55 large mason jars of finished product meth. They got cops all over the place. So, I ran from place to place until they finally did catch me. I was sent to prison due to the house being in my name. I went to prison with a term of one year. Still not accepting God into my life.

Got half of my time done and I called my dad's cell phone. Just wanted to say hi and let him know I'm OK and almost out. My step-mom answered and said, "Your dad is here in I.C.U. He's got stomach cancer." He got on the phone and I'll always remember his words; "Don't cry son, I'm going home." There was a pause and my step-mom said "Your dad has passed away." I got off the phone and was in a pinochle

tournament and my partner said "You'll get over it." I punched him in the eye and I was taken to the hole for 34 days. I went to prison with a year and ended up doing 4 years.

Got out and met my first wife and we had a son. I was working heavy equipment and making over \$40.00 an hour. Ran into someone that knew how to make meth. I was making the money and making meth. Too much for me to handle.

In 1994 I was locked in a garage for 8 days. My hair was orange and my eyes were yellow. I weighed 105 pounds and I felt like I was gonna die. I told my wife that "My time has come." She called a church called "Set Free," I was taken there for 3 days. I slept on the floor of the church. I remember waking up and there was a 6'7" tall white guy with a long pony tail squatting in front of me. He said "Are you ready?" I said "I need help." He lifted me up and gave me a hug and said "He's been waiting for you." I said "What do I have to do?" He told me to say a prayer and I did. Now you got to go to the ranch.

I was at the ranch for almost 3 weeks, and he came out there for a Bible study and I did the closing prayer. He said "God has given you two gifts," I said "What are they?" "One is your life. Your gift back is how you use it. Your second gift is that you are one of His personal prayer warriors." Don't ever stop praying. You see someone hurting, crying or in need, do it.

I'm here to tell you that I was in jail because I was tired of running. I turned myself in to do right. I went to court and they offered me 29 years for possession for sale. My heart fell.

When I finally went for sentencing it was 5 years of county jail. I was 30 months down and 22 to go and had done over 40 Bible courses. By the grace of our God, I am sponsored by Calvary Chapel – Big Bear Lake to start Bible College.

I want you all to know is to read, study and pray every day. When you don't, you open the door for that no-good evil Satan to come in and ruin your day.

Romans 8:28

"All things are possible, to those who believe and trust in Him with all thine heart"

I've now been out of jail for 2 years and belong to Calvary Chapel – Big Bear Lake. I started the prison writing ministry here and write to over 90 men and women doing time all over the United States. We offer Bible studies from the 1 Step to Freedom curriculum.

Persuaded? Are you convinced?

God "is not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. (2 Peter 3:9)

This is the most important question and greatest decision each of us will ever make. It is a matter of "life" or "second death" for ALL of us.

The non-believes have tried to change the term "Born again" into a mockery, a "weirdo" term. According to the Bible, you CANNOT see God or His Kingdom unless you are born again! We are all born of the flesh (water breaks and we are born) and must be born of the spirit (Repent of sin and turn to the salvation provide by God in His Son, Jesus)!

Please read, seriously consider and ask yourself, "Is Jesus 'God with us" as the prophet Isaiah foretold? And ask yourself, "Am I "Born again"?

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. (Isa 7:14-15)

Then Matthew quoted Isaiah:
"Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel (which means, God with us).
(Matt 1:23-24)

Jesus said to his disciples: "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me." (John 14:1-2)

Many are more like Philip. He did not recognize Jesus for who He is!

Jesus said to Philip: "Have I been with you so long, and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you

not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority, but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else believe on account of the works themselves...." (John 14:9-11)

A Jewish leader, Nicodemus, came to Jesus after dark and said: "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."

Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' (John 3:2-8)

Remember "Doubting Thomas"? Are you a doubter? Thomas said: "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." (John 20:25)

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. *Although the doors were locked*, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and

put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." (John 20:26-29)

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. (John 14:6)

Either Jesus was who he said he was or he is a liar. Each of us makes the decision to believe and accept Jesus as Savior and Lord or reject Him. By not accepting we are rejecting!

"Repent" is another term made fun of by Hollywood and others. Repent literally means, to make a 180 degree turn from one direction to another. Being "Persuaded" that Jesus is who the Word tells us that He is ("God come in the flesh") and repenting of a sinful life and turning to the salvation provided by God in Christ Jesus. "...for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus. whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith". (Romans 3:23-25) "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord". (Romans 6:23)

Going to church, your place of worship, Bible study or anything else does NOT save us anymore than swimming in the ocean or a lake makes us a fish. We must be "born again"!

Hello! My name is Ray Douglas and I'm an inmate clerk for the religious Services Department at Two Rivers Correctional Institution, which is located in Umatilla, OR.

The reason I'm writing you is to let you know how Moving On Ministry has touched lives here at Two Rivers.

When I started as a clerk, we didn't have any information on ministries that were willing to work with inmates. There were a couple of ministries that sent books or newsletters to us, but this was because the ministries took the initiative to just send us stuff. If a resident here asked us for information regarding a particular ministry, we couldn't help them because we didn't have a database of any kind.

After I was hired, my boss told me to make listings more available. As I dug around through a listing my family sent me, I found Chaplain Bob & Linda at Moving On Ministry. Right away they sent me their newsletter "Letter From M.O.M." (brilliant name – who doesn't want mail from mom?), "Pen-pals from M.O.M. (now discontinued) and "Resources From M.O.M."

Receiving these started me on a 3-year old, which is still ongoing, search for ministries to help us point the way to our wonderful master, Jesus. This has allowed myself and others to put together ministry handouts that have qualified and verified information.

Oct. – Dec. 2015

As this project grew and some handouts were given out, we found out many inmates didn't know what to expect from ministries. Linda took her valuable time to help me turn the handouts into guides to help the inmates and to help the ministries that were being contacted. Three guide samples were sent with this letter.

With help from Bob and Linda, we've been able to have a huge database. We have a newsletter registry so guys can sign up for any of 17 newsletters from various ministries. We get books all the time and Bibles to hand out. They've been the catalyst that has helped our available resources grow.

My prayer is that you will be able to support and continue to support Moving On Ministry. They make a real kingdom difference and even have me looking toward being in ministry when I get out of prison.
