“In the last part of your letter you said that you see anger and hurt . Well you hit the nail on the head, but let me explain to you why, maybe you’ll understand. My father left me when I was one, so I never met him. My mom left me for four years when I was five. I remember feeling unwanted and alone, and to make matters worse, the neighbors sexually molested me during the four years mom was gone. When I was nine, I went to live with my mom who would beat me everyday and sometimes lock me up in a closet all day. At school, the teachers would take me to the principle’s office to show him the marks on my arms left by extension cords. When he would ask, I always denied my mom was hitting me. When I was eleven, all my friends at school approached me to ask me if my mom was a prostitute? I have never felt so ashamed in my life, because I knew it was true, so at fourteen I started with the drugs. You said that I have to shape and mold my daughter, well these are the things that shaped and molded me. So, yes there is anger, bitterness, fear, shame, and a lot of other negative emotions. But I don’t want to live like this chaplain, it’s a miserable existence. I want to have love, joy and peace in my life. I want to be free of these negative emotions that bind me. Why won’t God help me and why can’t I get free? I have prayed for deliverance, I have prayed for healing for years and nothing. **JU**

Recommended Reading

For the new Christian, or the individual desiring to know God, we would like to recommend the following reading:

The Gospel of John – This is a great introduction of Christ’s walk on Earth.

The Book of Romans – This gives an introduction of many of the Bible stories shared and helps build familiarity of Christ’s plan for our lives.

The Purpose Driven Life by Rick Warren – 40 chapters will change your life in 40 days

Book of Proverbs – Read one chapter a day with the chapter read being the day of the month. This will allow the book to be read almost 12 times thru the year.

Ephesians 4 – 6 – This gives the pattern for life that we should live. All 7 S’s are displayed in these 3 chapters. We are given the purpose of the gifts, changing our character, husband/wife/family relationships, and the type of life we are to live and display.

Men’s Relational Toolbox – Another fine work by Gary Smalley with both of his sons adding to this book. This book avoids “male bashing” but rather teaches men to use and modify the inner tools they have to improve their relationships.

Prayer of Jabez – A truly fine first book from Bruce Wilkerson. This short book will change your mind about being disobedient to God by not taking care of people in need

Sharing Your Testimony

Rent to Own Salvation?

Many are familiar with the “Rent to Own” process of furniture purchase. This is actually a “try it before you buy it” process. The individual gets immediately delivery and just starts making payments. If the payments quit, the items are sacrificed and sometimes there are penalty costs. If the items are what the individual wants, there is a payoff and they are actually purchased. It is unfortunate that this concept has flowed over into the salvation theme. Individuals think that they can try a small piece of a relationship with Christ. They believe that if they try it and don’t like it, they can just let it go and no harm done. Salvation is an eternal and full commitment to Christ.

Turning ‘Life’ to Eternal Life

This is how the Lord had changed my life. I was out on the street living with my girlfriend and one day I started drinking and getting crazy with my girlfriend. She called me a bad name and I didn't like what she called me, so I pushed her down. She called the cops, knowing I had two strikes, and the cops came and took me to jail. So when I got there, I was too drunk for them to book me in, so they put me in the drunk-tank and I went to sleep.



When I woke up, I couldn't believe where I was and what I had done to get there, so they let me call to lock me in and I asked them "What am I in here for," and they told me spouse abuse, and I am looking at my third strike. Right there and then I started going crazy and I started crying because I didn't know what to do because I was looking at 'Life in prison', and never getting out. The pain was too hard and I wanted to give up and end my life. So, I called my friend on the phone and told her what happened and she told me "Allen, get on your knees and pray and ask the Lord to take off that 'life'." So, I hung up the phone and I laid on my bunk just thinking about what she told me to do. I didn't do it, because I didn't think nothing would happen. Three days later

I went to court and still was looking at 'life,' they wouldn't drop it. I went back to my cell and laid on my bunk again and couldn't eat at dinnertime. My world was gone. I would never see the streets again.

About 6:00 o'clock some young guy came in and I didn't know him. He asked me my name and I told him. He told me his name was Jonathan and he was from Tulare. He asked me how much time I am looking at and I told him 'life' and I started crying again because I didn't know what to do. He told me "Allen, do you know the Lord?" I told him "Not really, not that much," and he told me that the Lord will take off that 'life' if you pray and ask him into your life. I asked Jonathon "How do I do it?" and he told me to get my brown Bible and go to the back of it and read with him "My Decision to Receive Christ as my Savior." So, I did and he told me to read the word every day and get on my knees every night and ask him for forgiveness like my mom told me to. It was the best feeling I ever had in my life. It is like I am free at last. I don't care if I get 'life' or not, I was free.

Three weeks later, I had to go back to court and before I went, I prayed and read Psalms 91. When I went, I walked in the courtroom and I could feel the Lord inside the courtroom. So they called me up there and they told me that I was looking at **Four** years in prison. I looked up in the courtroom and thanked Him right there. I was so happy that I jumped for joy. When I got back to my cell on the 3rd floor, people could see the love that God gave me, in my Face. Thank God, Bob, I am free again and then when I went to B.W.D.F., I met one of God's Angels, and it was you! I

called you over to my cell and told you the good news that the Lord had done for me. There was a big smile on your face.

It was like that car you showed in the pictures.



Not only my outside was messed up,



But my inside was also messed up.

Now I am new inside and out.



Now I am at Delano reading my Bible everyday.

God is so good. Well, right now I am reading the book of Proverbs. I love the Bible. If God could change my life, He could change anybody. All they have to do is ask Him to come in their heart, and He will. **AF**

“Someway and Something Better”

So I said last night, there were things I needed to say, now I’m gonna say them.

Bob, my life was going nowhere fast. I was on a down hill slide with no way of stopping!

Then one day a man comes to my cell (41-105) and began a conversation about God. All my life I believed in God, even went to church as a child, yet I never gave my life to Him and asked for forgiveness.

Every time you came to the unit, you came to my cell and we talked. At first you talked, I just listened, but what I was hearing was catching my attention making me wonder if I was truly living my life right. The more you talked about how God had helped you overcome your spiritual struggles and everyday living problems, I came to understand that there was **someway and something better** than doing it my way for it was not working.

I started reading my Bible more and more, trying to get an understanding on how to live my life (spiritual) better, so I finally prayed and I felt like a burden was lifted from my shoulders, but something was missing, I didn’t feel whole!

The last time you came was a Monday night, and then a Thursday night and here you came walking through the doors for Bible study. That

was the night my life changed for the good and forever, for I accepted God as my personal Savior, it seemed as if my worries, all my problems, were lifted and I felt completely at ease, I felt whole!

Because of you my life has changed and it is for the good and best. I'm very grateful. I wish I had done it sooner, yet again I'm even pleased I did it with you, for you started me on a journey of a lifetime that is rewarding as well as fulfilling.

So I just sit back and remember my life before Christ. I was on my way to self-destruction. People always said; "Look for the silver lining in the dark cloud." They never told me why! Well I found out, it was lightening getting ready to strike.

Now with God in my life, I don't have many "dark days" and the few I do, I know God will help me through them and things will be better!

Again I thank you for everything you have done for me and all the other people. Please keep up the work of God, for it changes lives for the good!

Forever I in your debt, and grateful to be there, for it changed my life for the good! **SW**

A Woman's Mission

I have been asked to write a portion of my testimony. Well, it all started May 2003. I had already been locked up 5 times. I was in lock down. I was strung out and mad. My veins were full of poison, all I could think about was what I was going to do to get high. Who could I rip off? **My mission in life** was to get what I wanted at any cost. I had no emotions. I did not care who I hurt. Then one Monday evening I had a woman come to my door. I was very bored, had nothing to do, so I started

talking to her. I don't know what it was about her, but she made an impact on me. There were always people that talked to me about God but never impacted me. I don't know. When I get to heaven, I am going to ask God why she got thru to me? Maybe it was the light that she had. Or maybe she could relate to me like no one else could. I am not sure but I actually listened. I had always known God, but not Jesus. So I knew since I was young I was doomed to go to hell. Then this Caucasian woman came and told me there was hope for me of all people. I am not sure that I got it right there and then. So after that I started doing Bible studies with a chaplain. My thought was, okay I will do it. It will give me something to do. That is where I believe God started chipping away the ice. What started out to be entertainment, ended up being what changed my life. It is a process you don't change over night. But the closer and more knowledge of God you have, the faster you change. You get a vast hunger for Him. No matter how much you have read or heard, you want more.

When I got out, I went straight to a church, and I got connected. That is one of the things that have kept me sane and sober is the church body I was in. I left my hometown and moved to Tulare. God placed me in another good church that has been my home ever since then. They have picked me up when I fell. See, God places people in your life, but you have to be open. It is easy to serve God in jail, but what are you going to do when you go out? If you go back to the same life style, you will fall. When you get out, get connected to a church that is Bible based. Somewhere you will not wait to be called, but you will run to. Maybe it won't be the first one you go

to, but ask God to show you where you belong. You will know it just feels right. I have been out for little over two years and life is not easier; on the contrary it is harder. But God is always there to pick me up when I can no longer walk. He has to be the one that keeps you strong. Only He can fill up the void in your heart that replaces the poison out of your veins. **KN**

Like a Dog - To and Fro

It's like God said, there is nothing new under the sun, meaning to me in God's eyes, God sees the same thing that goes on in people's lives. Like crimes, gangs, drugs, adultery, abuse and other temptations. And as God said to me once more in the book of Jeremiah 46:28, But I must discipline you; I can't let you go unpunished. Amen. **AC**

I read and enjoyed your newsletter. Keep them coming, please. As for myself, well, I'm a 36 yr. Old Mexican. I am Christian and I do believe in our Lord and Him taking our sins for us by dying on the cross. I used to attend Victory Outreach in Carson, CA. with Pastor Robert. Then I went to Calvary Chapel with Pastor Isaac in Torrance, CA., then back to Victory Outreach in Carson. I stopped going about 2 years ago. I started smoking weed and using cocaine cause I thought it was the answer to my problems. I've been married for 10 years to a good woman and three beautiful children and a 12 month old grandchild from my 17 year old. I'm a good dad and man. I just had a setback due to marital problems and was kicked out of the house and felt completely lost, and came back to the system. I blame no one but myself. I am responsible for my own actions and only God can save and help me. I need Him (God) in my life or I will end up in here forever. I don't want that. I want to be saved and serve God with my wife and kids on my side. I'm tired of living wrong. Please pray for me to be strong and be saved. I need all the help of prayer I can get please. You asked me how I stumbled on your ministry. I was in Delano with a Puerto Rican Christian who shared your news letter with me and gave me your address. So now I find myself writing you seeking help from God. **RG**

The Cost of Incarceration

The numbers and figures quoted will be for the **California** state prisons, the nation's largest state prison system only. Although California is #1 of the states in cost, realize that there are another 49 states with the same dilemma. The LA Times reported in March 13, 2005 that "**the number of men and women in state lockups soared to 165,000 – a record number that jammed prisons to twice their intended capacity.**"

On February 23, 2005, the number of inmates was 162,276. At CSP Solano, a system designed for 2,600, was housing nearly 6,000. Mule Creek State Prison in Ion, California houses about 10,000 inmates.

July 2005 saw the opening in Kern County of prison #33, for the state of California with the dedication of Delano II, designed to house 5,000 inmates with a construction cost of \$380 million.

Average yearly inmate cost - **\$30,929**


Number of State Prisons – **33**

We would like to note that California's prison population is growing at a pace that could fill two new prisons every year. These prisons had a cost on an average of \$280 million to build and \$80 million a year to operate (Little Hoover Commission Report, Jan. 1998).


In June 1996, it was predicted that 17 new prisons will be needed by the year 2006 with the projected prison population growing to 240,000 inmates. Realize that the projected cost of incarcerating offenders with a minimum 20-year sentence is \$500,000. \$25,000 operational cost to house a prisoner in California for a year, not taking into account the fixed costs. A county jail bed costs \$19,700 per year. Elderly inmates typically cost up to \$65,000 annually, primarily because of their greater medical needs.
