Jail and Prison Ministry

What is it; Why do it?

When I do church presentations for Jail and Prison Ministry, many individuals have the set emotion “I could never do that.” I ask individuals if they ever thought of doing ministry to inmates. Their immediate response is “I could never go into a prison environment and preach to inmates.”

So, is preaching in a prison environment the definition of prison ministry? With this article, I am hopefully going to broaden the thinking of individuals of what jail and prison ministry is. I will hopefully show that it is larger and more diverse than we normally think of it.

First of all, there is the question of “why?” Perhaps the “why” can be summarized in Matthew 25:35-46

Matthew 25:35 For I was an hungred, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in:

Matthew 25:36 Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me.

Matthew 25:37 Then shall the righteous answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungred, and fed [thee]? or thirsty, and gave [thee] drink?

Matthew 25:38 When saw we thee a stranger, and took [thee] in? or naked, and clothed [thee]?

Matthew 25:39 Or when saw we thee sick, or in prison, and came unto thee?

Matthew 25:40 And the King shall answer and say unto them, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done [it] unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done [it] unto me.

Matthew 25:41 Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels:

Matthew 25:42 For I was an hungred, and ye gave me no meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me no drink:

Matthew 25:43 I was a stranger, and ye took me not in: naked, and ye clothed me not: sick, and in prison, and ye visited me not.

Matthew 25:44 Then shall they also answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungred, or athirst, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not minister unto thee?

Matthew 25:45 Then shall he answer them, saying, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did [it] not to one of the least of these, ye did [it] not to me.

Matthew 25:46 And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal.

Also noted in the “why” of the ministry, are shown some of the “what.” Christ mentioned of “feeding, giving a cold drink, clothing, taking in, and visiting. I also want to express the miracles that are seen by just taking the time to send a card of postcard to one of these individuals to let them know they are not forgotten. How about keeping their

concerns in prayer? How about just holding their hand during times of loss? I even have one inmate that is 19 years of age and cannot read or write English or Spanish. Can you realize the joy of someone reading his mail to him or just spending 20 minutes to read a Bible story to him?

Ever thought about the environment these individuals will be released to? How about writing to inmates relatives to clean up the environment where the inmate will be released to?

Also, look at the talents of these individuals that are displayed in the poems, art, and writings in this newsletter. How about a nice note of encouragement to let them know they do have the potential.

POTENTIAL

Potential is a word not used enough. I often ask individuals of when did the small redwood tree seed get the potential to grow into a 200’ tree? The answer is that it ALWAYS had it. And then I ask, “What made the seed germinate and start to grow?” The answer is a forest fire went through and cleared the vegetation. Many times the inmate is going through that same intense fire the seed went through and is now ready to germinate and fulfill the full potential that God put in from the beginning.

With the story of Philip and the Eunuch, Philip asked if the Eunuch understood what he read?

Acts 8:30 And Philip ran thither to [him], and heard him read the prophet Esaias, and said, Understandest thou what thou readest?

The eunuch answered

Acts 8:31 And he said, How can I, except some man should guide me? And he desired Philip that he would come up and sit with him.

Letters that Express it All

These are actual letters from some of the different incarcerated individuals. The names have been removed. Our first newsletter went out October 2003. We receive many of these letters each week.

Faith

Greetings to each individual who is reading this. Here is a clear blessing from the Lord. Pastor Bob, A.K.A. "Angel Bob" has continued to write me and just his letters are so much encouragement. I'm hoping to pass this on. Angel Bob, thank you for all you do! Thank you also for this M.O.M. newsletter where brothers & sisters can enjoy each others company, no matter if these prison walls separate us. May the Lord continue to bless each of you daily.

I've titled this piece "Faith" because of it's importance. I don't know how many people know this, but this is what it says in the Bible. "Without faith it is impossible to please Him . . . " (Heb. 11:6). Jesus loves you! We must have faith in his Word that all the things He tells us will come. Faith, what is it? "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1). Now I don't know about you, but if I couldn't see something, I guess you can say, I did not believe in it. Growing up, I heard about the "Boogie Man." He was all that. One sorry dude that was around every corner. Me, I had to go peek around all those corners to see this dude. "Santa," yeah, I must of hit his "bad" list, and yes, I even heard about Jesus. And yes I can say that He was just like the others. I couldn't see Him, so He was "fake" to me. I'm gonna tell you something that

may be shocking – I see Jesus every day! Jesus is nothing like the "Boogie Man," other than, yes, Jesus is around every corner. (I made a mistake in writing this when I wrote "I see Jesus every day." I should've put in the Bible scripture that is about "us" being made in His image). As for Jesus around every corner, see Prov. 15:3 for the best understanding. Everyday we must lean on faith, grab hold of it. Eph. 6:16 tells us that "The shield of faith . . . shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked." I'm a prisoner here in Corcoran State Prison – S.H.U. The fiery darts come to me in many ways, so I know for those that read this on the other side of these walls, they come even more. We must always carry our shield of faith everywhere.

I must close with one more ok, well two actually. In the Bible is says in Eph. 2:8-9 that "For grace are ye saved, through faith, and that not of yourselves. It is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast." Nothing can save us but faith. How important is that? And I'll close with James 2:17 "Even so, faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone." We must use our faith in everything. Constantly talk to our Lord. Ask Him what part does He play in whatever it is you're doing. I've come to know that Jesus Christ is everywhere and in everything and in everyone. If you are lacking in faith, let's fix that. Romans 10:17 tells us "So then faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the word of God." Hearing the preaching and teaching of God's Word. Reading the Bible yourself will stir faith in your heart. Today is the day of salvation, tomorrow may never come. Please read Luke 11:9 and Mark 11:22. **JMC**

Recommended Reading

For the new Christian, or the individual desiring to know God, we would like to recommend the following reading:

The Gospel of John – This is a great introduction of Christ's walk on Earth.

The Book of Romans – This gives an introduction of many of the Bible stories shared and helps build familiarity of Christ's plan for our lives.

The Purpose Driven Life by Rick Warren – 40 chapters will change your life in 40 days

Book of Proverbs – Read one chapter a day with the chapter read being the day of the month. This will allow the book to be read almost 12 times thru the year.

Ephesians 4 – 6 – This gives the pattern for life that we should live. All 7 S's are displayed in these 3 chapters. We are given the purpose of the gifts, changing our character, husband/wife/family relationships, and the type of life we are to live and display.

Men's Relational Toolbox – Another fine work by Gary Smalley with both of his sons adding to this book. This book avoids "male bashing" but rather teaches men to use and modify the inner tools they have to improve their relationships.

Prayer of Jabez – A truly fine first book from Bruce Wilkerson. This short book will change your mind about being disobedient to God by not taking care of people in need

Needs after Release

Individuals being released from incarceration have the same common needs of all individuals. There is a need of self-respect and self esteem. Many have a need of housing. Most are coming back looking for employment. Some are facing classes for AA, NA, or Domestic Violence. Some need to enroll in educational or vocational programs. Most would appreciate someone to just talk to or have a mentor. Fellowship with the right people is ALWAYS needed. For many these are totally new expectations and experiences.

One inmate expressed wonderfully the problem of being released. He stated that everything is slow to happen while incarcerated. It seems like an eternity as you wait for your next transfer or assignment. You feel like you are running at 5 miles per hour. Then, when released to the world, you are put into an environment that is running at 200 miles per hour. This drastic change of environments tends to overcome individuals and they have a hard time adapting. We hear of transitions from one area to another in each of our lives. Someone to just talk with about the feelings and changes the individuals are going thru is a great healer. The Bible says that each of us should be a "brother" to help the other one up when he falls. Other scripture talks about "sticking closer than a brother" we can often help with sharing life experiences or just listening to someone in need. We don't always have to solve the problems, but many times need to just "lend an ear" so that someone might share their needs or hurts with us. Many men have heard from their wives "*I don't want you to fix it, just listen*". We need to just listen.

Sharing Your Testimony

There are 4 parts to an individual's testimony;

1. What my life was like before I met Jesus
2. How I realized I needed Jesus
3. How I committed my life to Jesus
4. The difference Jesus has made in my life.

But in reality, those who believe in Jesus have the testimony of God in them; Each of us needs to periodically share our testimony with others. The importance is not what you have done, but what God is doing.

1. Your testimony;
2. Your life lessons
3. Your godly passions
4. the Good News

God will make all things new
What are some things I should finish once I start?

New life in Christ. We must maintain the confident faith we had when we first believed.

Seek and Ye Shall Find

God bless you and your families. First I want to say thank you for the inspiring booklet. I love to read people's testimonies and how much God has had a positive part in their life. The following is a piece of my life.

You see, I was separated from my 4 dear children in 1980. The state had a part in it because I used heroin for 13 years and chose the street life. Well, that came with jails, prostitution, robberies, etc. I didn't have contact with my children all those many years, little alone had God in my life.

Well to jump in to life today update. I knew where my children were from SSW in Stockton, California address. So, I wrote there one day in 2001. I prayed for a response, day after day. I asked God "what kind of mom would just walk out of her children's life? You know I put them there instead of having them live the horrible street life." That is what I tried saying to God is I tried giving them a better life.

Well, today I have writing privileges with all 4 of my children. My oldest has a baby, my first grandson. 2 of my girls live in Stockton California, and my middle one lives in Las Vegas.

My dearest son is 14 and lives in Apple Valley, California, in a boys home, and he and I write the most. Chaplain Bob, I since have been trying to find my soul and religion, faith process. So I have been going to Catholic Catechism class on Tuesday nights. I need to hold on to God, cuz He "God" has helped me find my children after all these years, and given me the hope to hold on.

Well sorry to have bored you sir. It's just when I read your powerful words, and awesome testimonies, I feel the urge to talk about how God has touched my life and children's lives as well.

NOTE From Bob: I think we all agree that God loves the family and wants to strengthen the family. This lady has stated how much she loves her children, but realized she had to let go of the children to keep them from a life in the streets. Whatever God Teaches through Pain, is Gain

We are on “tight house” and so all our programming is shut down right now. The TC has become sick and has been engaging in negative behaviors not conducive to the principles and values of TC. The participation and attitudes of the participants here has become more of a compliance to receive an out date, than endorsement in the TC values and principles for the sake of change and recovery. So, we’ve been stripped of everything for the past 2 weeks. We’ve been on non-verbal and haven’t been able to talk or anything. We sit on our beds all day long, staring at our roommates. We’ve been doing a few of their processes like taking accountability of everything we’ve done to contribute to this, and confronting others. Its been the hardest thing I’ve ever had to do in life. But through this experience, I can honestly say I’ve been humbled/ Not only has this brought me back to the level where I needed to be because I got too big for my britches, but it’s strengthened my faith and given me more one on one time to spend with God and pray and read His Word and really do some soul searching and internalizing. The past month or two I’d become very comfortable here just trying to fly under the radar, so my time goes easy. I’d started falling back to old sneaky behaviors and didn’t even realize it. I thought that I was doing so good and that I had all I needed from this place. But in all actuality I didn’t. I stopped going to church. I stopped praying. I stopped reading the Word and when I noticed that, is when I shut the door on the Lord and looked the other way. Things started looking negative

and ugly to me and I wasn’t grateful for nothing. I was stuck in me, me, me and only what would benefit me. Well, I have to say that I am so grateful and blessed that this happened now. I realize now that this was Satan working in my life and I was sucked into his game. I read this thing in a magazine that said; ***”Satan has a powerful tool to use against good people, it is distraction. He would have good people fill their life with ‘good things.’ so there is no room for the essential things. Have you unconsciously been caught in that trap?”***

That is so true. That’s what happened to me. I got distracted. I don’t know if you Eddie B. is but he’s here tonight out back, but we are not allowed to go to it cuz of this tight house. Last Sunday was my birthday and I went to church, and of course the topic was just what I needed to hear about making right choices. It seemed like it was directed right to me. Yeah, I didn’t get presents or talk to anyone or do anything but to go to church. Honestly, that was the best B-day present I could have asked for. I’ve been reading the Purpose Driven Life book and it’s really gotten me thinking about how I’m living my life and what I could do to strengthen my relationship with him.

I only have 3 ½ months left here and I know it will be here before I know it. To tell you the truth, I’m kind of scared to get out. The last time I was out, I was barely 18 and was using. I’m 20 now and never lived a sober life. I’ve never been out and had to be a grown up and I don’t know really what it is like to

be an adult. I don't want to fail when I get out. I don't want to relapse, and I definitely don't want to fall back into old behaviors and be in active addiction. Luckily my mom said I could move home, and be with her and family. My parents divorced when I was 12 years old and at that point I decided to move to Texas to be with my mom. Well a few years passed, I went back and forth, and then I ended up moving to Boise with my mom for a job she had gotten up here, and I've been here ever since. So, up here is no good for me. Yes, I have a few sober friends in recovery here, but not enough for me to stay and risk it, you know. I want to go back down to Utah, and be with family. My mom moved back down to Utah almost 2 years ago. All that's here is old using buddies and old playgrounds. I want a fresh start. I've prayed and prayed about this and I truly believe I'm doing the right thing by staying in TC the full 9 months and then

going to Utah because I did want to stay here for a while and go to the Chrysalis House with Nannette, but I don't think I can honestly stay strong and make it up here. I'm really excited too, because I received my GED last December at the prison and so when I get out, I'll be going to cosmetology school down there. My sister's mother-in-law owns a school and just sent me a letter of acceptance. I'm really hoping they have Celebrate Recovery program down there. I want to find a good church once I get there.

I've been reading one Proverbs a day like you suggested. I also read one Psalms a day and then I skip around a lot. Last night, me and my roommates read James. I love going back and reading stuff I've highlighted in my Bible, because everytime I get something new from it. Either that or it takes me back. **SB**

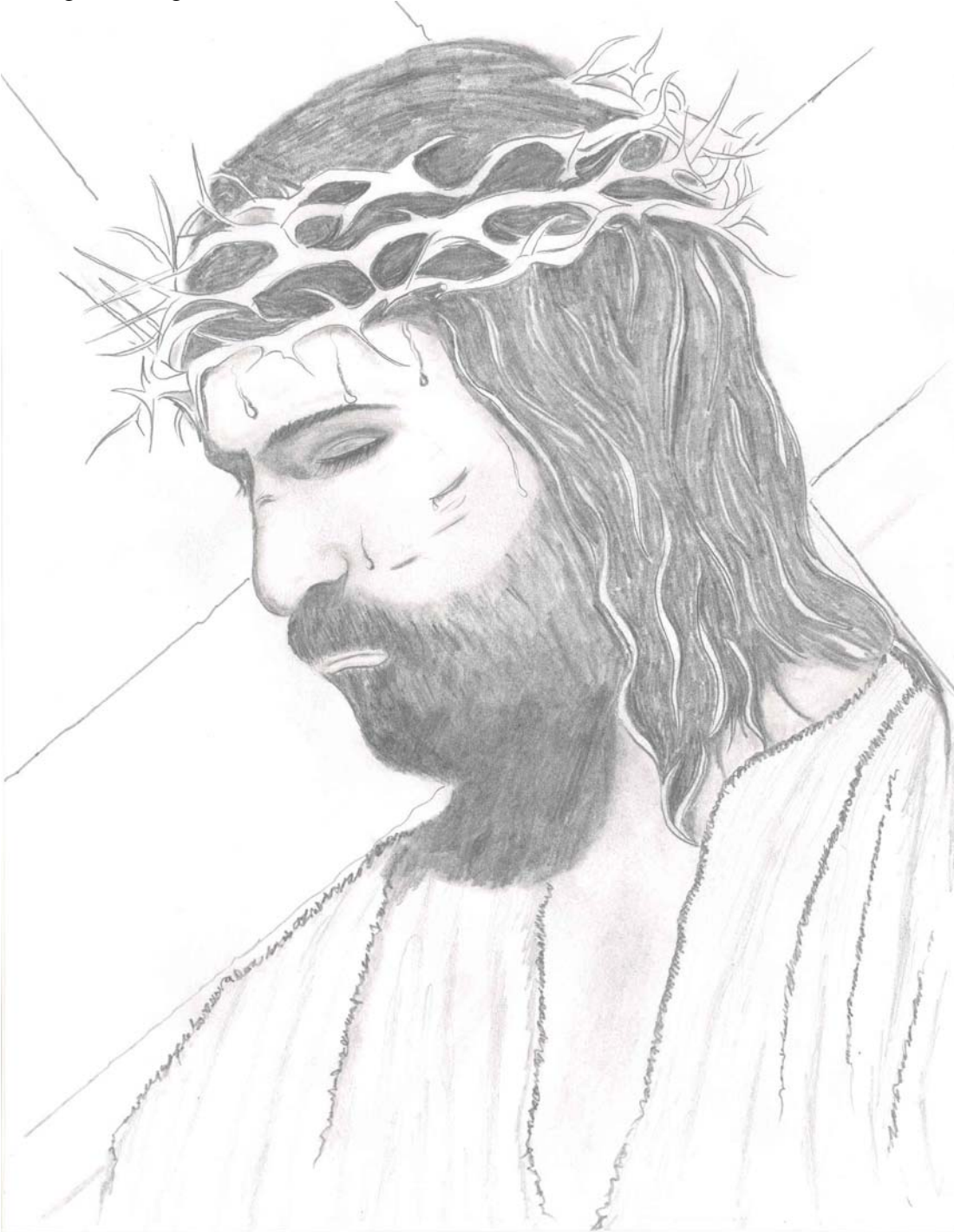
I will ascend these encompassing
